· After inhalation:

Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a postion for breathing. If not breathing, if breathing is irregular or if respiratory arrest occurs, provide artificial respiration or oxygen by trained personnel. It may be dangerous to the person providing aid to give mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. Get medical attention. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway. Loosen tight clothing such as a collar, tie, belt or waistband.

· After skin contact:

Seek medical treatment.

Flush contaminated skin with plenty of water.

Remove contaminated clothing and shoes.

Continue to rinse for at least 10 minutes.

Wash clothing before reuse. Clean shoes thoroughly before reuse.

· After eye contact:

Immediately flush with plenty of water. After initial flushing, remove any contact lenses and continue flushing for at 15 least minutes, Have eyes examined and tested by medical personnel.

· After swallowing:

Wash out mouth with water. Remove dentures if any. Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. If material has been swallowed and the exposed person is conscious, give small quantities of water to drink. Stop if the exposed person feels sick as vomiting may be dangerous. Do not induce vomiting unless directed to do by medical personnel. If vomiting occurs, the head should be kept low so that vomit does not enter lungs. Get medical attention. Never give anything by mouth to an unconscious person. If unconscious, place in recovery position and get medical attention immediately. Maintain an open airway. Loosen tight clothing such as collar, tie, belt or waistband.

· Respiratory protection:
